## August trail project draws overwhelming response

The August 28 and 29 trail project has attracted many volunteers interested in helping to build trails in Red Rock Canyon Open Space. Initially Volunteers for Outdoor Colorado (VOC) which is sponsoring the trail building weekend in conjunction with the City of Colorado Springs TOPS Program intended to limit the number of volunteers to 150. However, in response to the large number of people volunteering they increased their quota to 250.

VOC and TOPS will be doing preparatory work the weekend before the trail project.


